Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Throughout the Easter season we have head many stories from the Gospels about how Jesus appeared to his disciples following the resurrection. With each appearance, Jesus shows himself to the disciples who at first are scared, then perhaps confused, but throughout are trying to make sense of what happens next. They know that things will never be the same. But what exactly will their lives be like?

Jesus at first passes through the locked doors of the upper room and greets the disciples who fear for their lives after watching Jesus be taken away to be killed. Each time he appears before them he greets them by saying, 'Peace be with you.' Jesus has said this many times before. Whenever they were anxious, whenever they were riled up, Jesus instructs the disciples to be at peace. 'You believe in God. Believe also in me.' The brave women ventured out to honor Jesus' body with myrrh and spices that first Easter morning, and were not disappointed! Now Jesus goes to the men who were afraid they might meet the same fate as their crucified Teacher and shows them there is no need to hide behind locked doors.

When the disciples begin to venture out, life goes on it seems. Things will never be the same, but still the disciples go back to their work. They return to something familiar. Perhaps to help them cope, perhaps simply to pay the bills, but nevertheless, the go back to their boats and cast their nets. It is here that Jesus meets them again. At first the disciples think that they are seeing a ghost. But Jesus comes to them and speaks to them. Good on them for getting out from behind those locked doors, but now Jesus lets them know that they're not crazy. They're not hallucinating in their grief. Things will never be the same.

The new that Jesus is alive changes everything for the disciples. This Jesus is who he promised. And if this man has power over death itself, what is there left for them to be afraid of? The new life the disciples begin after the resurrection doesn't happen all at once. They doubt, they hide, they struggle, and are afraid. One moment they seem fearless, but the next



they're back to the mundane—mending their fishing nets. And that is okay. Jesus doesn't call them, or us, to some escapist life. Ours is not meant to be a life locked away from the world or a faith behind the safety of our doors. Rather, Jesus having burst open the tomb proceeds to open the doors we shut ourselves behind. He follows us into our homes, into our workplaces, into every place we go. This

same Jesus who conquered Hell, visits his disciples at work, and blesses their catch. This same Jesus who banished death, is happy to sit at breakfast on the shore and remind his disciples of his love for them.

In the 23rd Psalm, we read 'surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life...' But this translation, as poetic as it is, doesn't capture what's really going on here. The Hebrew says that goodness and mercy 'chase after me.' Goodness and mercy don't follow like a puppy dog, but they gallop after us. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, pursues us. He chases after us so that he might be near us, bless us, and love us where are. Let us see him with us everywhere we go, and gladly let him bless our work and our play, so that we might one day follow him to where he is, as well.
