

Pentecost has been called the birthday of the Church. It was on this day that the gift of the Holy Spirit was given to the followers of Jesus. They were a grieving, confused and cowardly bunch, totally unable to understand all that been happening to them, and completely unable to respond to those events. Their leader had been crucified and dead. Then he was risen and among them once more. But now he was gone again, gone in a departure filled with promises of heaven, but gone nonetheless.

Luke describes what happened on that first *Pentecost* by using images such as tornado-like winds, flames of fire and preaching in strange and unknown languages. Whatever it was that those followers of Jesus experienced, it is clear that God was mightily and mysteriously at work among them. The change that was being wrought in them was *not* their doing. They were not digging deep into their own resources in order to become better, stronger and more accomplished followers of Jesus. *Pentecost is the story of God's spirit doing his thing according to his purposes*.

Our *Pentecost* celebration centers on this fact: That it is God working in us who does far more than we could hope or imagine. It is not our strength, our intelligence, our good intentions that make the work of the church possible. It is the gift of God, the Holy Spirit, which does these things, strengthening us to do his will and making the miraculous possible.

Whatever happened to those ancient followers of Jesus on that first *Pentecost*, it transformed their lives, it strengthened them to do God's will, and it empowered them to change the world. Had they been left to themselves, without the gift of the Holy Spirit, you and I would never have heard the Good News of Jesus Christ at all. But Christ saw to it that they were not left to


themselves. He had promised that he would come back ...and on the fiftieth day after Easter he did.

This is what we celebrate at *Pentecost*: Christ coming back to you and to me in our lives today and in our Church, transforming us and changing us ...empowering us to transform our lives and the life of the world around us. Thanks be to God for *Pentecost*: The first one and the one which we experience in life and ministry every day of our lives.

A Pentecost Message from Bishop Kucharek

all suffering, to keep us from despair, and to look upon us with favor, that we might feel the fire of love, love one another from our hearts, and remain together of one mind in peace. [Similarly, compare ELW 395.]

As we embark on this season of Pentecost, may This Sunday, May 20, is Pentecost Sunday, the day in which the church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples (Acts 2:1-13), making it the birthday of the church. Its name derives from the fact that it falls 50 days after, and including, Easter Sunday. Church altars, pulpits, lecterns, and banners will be adorned in red to symbolize the fire of the Holy Spirit. Readings will recount the events of that first Pentecost and hymns will invite the Holy Spirit to come into our lives. Among our congregations, some worshippers will be celebrating the occasion by wearing the color red, others will be donating red geraniums to adorn the worship space, some may read the lessons in other languages as a reminder that at Pentecost the disciples spoke in other languages, and coffee hour may even feature a birthday cake for the church.

Pentecost Sunday begins the season of Pentecost in our liturgical year. From now until Advent, the focus of the church will be on our Christian calling as the followers of Christ. Just as the coming summer and fall months are a season in which we nurture growth for a plentiful harvest, so we in the church are commissioned to

reach out to others in our church, in our communities, and in the world and bear fruit that reflects our calling to make Christ known to a world in spiritual, emotional, and physical need. At his Ascension, Jesus promised the Holy Spirit and called his disciples, and us, to "be (his) witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

A verse from a Pentecost hymn of Martin Luther calls upon the Holy Spirit to give us the brightness God's Holy Spirit fill you with the fire of love for Christ and others, sustain you throughout the challenges of life, and work through you that you may produce good fruit and be Christ's witnesses "to the ends of the earth."
