Dear Sisters and Brothers,

When Jesus rose from the dead, scars stretched across his palms. For forty days, Jesus appeared to his disciples. But more than that, he let them touch him and ate with them to show them that it was really him and not a ghost or a hallucination. And after forty days had ended, Jesus ascended into heaven *bodily*. Even his scars, now glorified, have been taken up into Heaven. When God became human, he united himself to our nature for good. In Jesus, God is, was, and will always be united to us. Why did God do this? Why is it so important that Christ forever has united to humanity?

Saint Ignatius pastored the Church in Antioch that Paul founded. Ignatius and his friend Polycarp were disciples of the Apostle John. In a letter to the Church at Ephesus, Ignatius wrote, "There is one Physician who is possessed both of flesh and spirit; both made and not made; God existing in flesh; true life in death; both of Mary and of God; first passible and then impassible: Jesus Christ our Lord."

Ignatius penned one of the most beautiful sentences ever written while being escorted to his execution in Rome. In a letter sent before his arrival, he tells the Roman Christians to let him die. He explains: "Let me receive the pure light, for when I arrive in Heaven, I will be a human being."

What in the world does he mean that he will "be a human being?" Is he not a human already? Ignatius assures the saints in Rome that though in the eyes of the world he will die, he will in fact be more alive than ever. At the resurrection he will not just be a spirit, he will not be less human—in fact, he will be more human.

Because of sin's grasp on us, death now corrupts our bodies and spoils our souls. God become fully human and to show us what it means to be human. In his body of flesh, he started a new creation (2 Cor 5:17). He is the first fruits of the dead (Col 1:18). In the resurrection, we will follow our first fruits as the full harvest. We will become incorrupt and immortal (1 Cor 15:53).

Jesus' Ascension into Heaven is perhaps a mostly overlooked or under appreciated teaching of our faith. Yet it matters that Christ remains human even after his ascent into heaven *because we follow him as humans*. Our future is not as ghosts, or some wispy beings on clouds. At the resurrection, we will all become fully human, because we will be fully alive. We will be freed from those things that hold us back—not only the sickness and pain and weaknesses of body, but those of our mind and spirit. Our hearts and minds and wills will no longer resist God or try to assert ourselves over our fellows. We will become what Christ is in his glorified body. We will be the way God always intended. I suspect Ignatius had something like this in mind. He writes "the glory of God is the human being fully alive.

The fact that Jesus kept his body after his resurrection, ascended into Heaven with his body, and will return to raise us so that "we will be made like he is" (1 John 3:2) reassures us that his incarnation and birth was more than just a rescue mission. Jesus came to die for us, but also to unite us to himself forever. During this Easter season we celebrate, in a way, the fulfillment of Christmas. We see that Jesus, having defeated sin, death, and the devil, delights still to be Emmanuel: God-with-us. And knowing that we will share in God's own life in Heaven, we are able to begin to live a new life of love and holiness already now. We are freed from sin and death and the fear of them so that we can live no longer for self or out of fear, but joyfully for God and for one another.
